

Jonathan L. Walton is an author, preacher, and scholar of religion. He is the Plummer Professor of Christian Morals and the Pusey Minister in the Memorial Church of Harvard University.

Much of Professor Walton's scholarship focuses on evangelical Christianity, and its relationship to mass media and political culture. His first book, *Watch This! The Ethics and Aesthetics of Black Televangelism* (NYU Press 2009), examines the theological and political traditions of African American religious broadcasters.

He is also an outspoken advocate for social justice and civil rights. His work and insights have been featured in several national and international news outlets including the *New York Times*, *CNN*, and the *BBC*.

Professor Walton's latest book *A Lens of Love: Reading the Bible in Its World for Our World* (Westminster John Knox Press 2018), is an extension of his work from the pulpit and classroom. The book is the interpretative exploration of the Bible from the perspective of the most vulnerable and violated characters in scriptures.

Walton earned his PhD in Religion & Society and MDiv from Princeton Theological Seminary. He also holds a BA in Political Science from Morehouse College in Atlanta.
